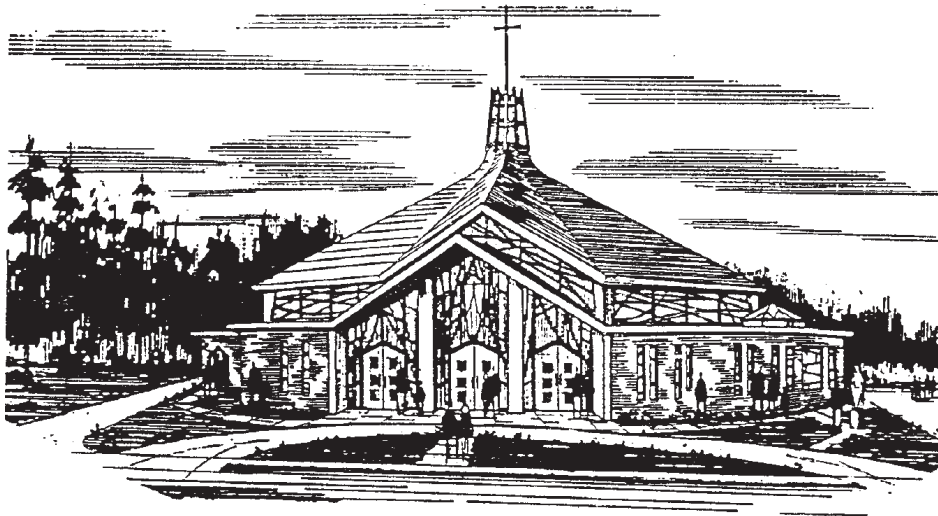

Message from the Pastor:

This weekend we celebrate Father's Day as well as the first day of summer!

Today's readings seem very apropos to reflect on our own summer activities including that of being at the seashore. But can you imagine yourself at this scene? You are in a small sailboat with Jesus and the apostles. A great storm comes up and the waves crash against the boat. Jesus, who must be very tired, stays asleep. The apostles, afraid of drowning, wake Jesus up. "Be still," he tells the storm at sea, and at once there is a great calm. The disciples' mood switches from terror to awe at this sign, which recalls so vividly the words of God in the first reading. Jesus invites the disciples to "cross to the other side." The storm at sea is both a terrifying natural event and a metaphor for overwhelming difficulties that the Church encounters on its journey of discipleship. In either case, Jesus is in the midst of His disciples urging them to greater faith, responding to their fears, and delivering them from danger. The disciples have yet to discover who Jesus is and trust in him; and so do we. During Ordinary Time – and the summer months – it's a good time to reflect how we journey with Jesus, crossing from where we are to where He leads.

As we celebrate and honor all Fathers today in a special way let us also pray that God's bountiful blessings will be bestowed upon them always for their unconditional love and guidance and that they will be guided by God's love in the challenges they face in their daily lives.

Missionary Co-Op Sunday July 12, 2015.

A community of Sisters in Cebu, Philippines the Sisters have dedicated their lives to rescuing women and young girls from prostitution. These girls, usually minors, are victims of poverty; some are being sold into prostitution by their own families in order to raise money. They do not know any other world. Four to five times each week, the Sisters go out to the night clubs and bars, dressed in civilian clothing, undercover, to convince them to escape.
