## Message from the Pastor:

This week, in addition to the official arrival of autumn on Wed, Sept. 23<sup>rd</sup>, Pope Francis begins his Apostolic Journey to both Cuba and the United States for the first time. Beginning with Sunday, Sept. 20<sup>th</sup> through Sunday, Sept. 27<sup>th</sup>, some of the highlights of his trip include visiting three cities in Cuba; moving on to Washington, DC – first meeting with President Obama, then midday Prayer with U.S. bishops at Saint Matthew’s Cathedral, followed by Fr. Junipero Serra Canonization Mass at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. On his second day there he will address a Joint Session of Congress – the first Pope to ever do so. On to NYC, he will address the United Nations General Assembly on Friday followed by Mass at Madison Square Garden. He will wind up his trip next weekend with two days in Philadelphia at the festivities surrounding the World Meeting of Families. I encourage you to find time to follow some of his itinerary, speeches and homilies – the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops ([www.usccb.org](http://www.usccb.org)) and The World Meeting of Families ([www.worldmeeting2015.org](http://www.worldmeeting2015.org)) websites are great resources to review. We will also be showing some of the events on our large screen in our Church – please see insert in today’s Bulletin.

Moving to today’s Gospel of Mark, when Jesus tried to tell his disciples about how he would soon suffer and die, they were afraid to ask him any questions. They acted as though everything would stay the same. They even argued about who was the greatest among them. So Jesus corrected them by saying “If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all.” Embracing a small child, Jesus told the disciples, “Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me.” He wanted them to understand that they were to be willing servants with the childlike qualities of innocence, honesty, and lack of pretension. Jesus identified Himself with the innocent child who is completely dependent on His Father.

I wish to join Archbishop Myers, today, on Catechetical Sunday throughout the United States, in recognizing those who give of themselves so generously in fulfilling the critically important ministry of catechesis for the Church. May God richly bless our Catechetical Leaders and our new Youth Minister along with all our volunteers for all that they do to nurture God’s children in our Parish. Let us also pray that parents and grandparents will share their faith with their children through their examples by the way they live and the choices they make.

Also, this Sunday at the 10:30am Mass, we will welcome and pray for thirty-two Confirmation candidates who will begin their journey together with their new Confirmation Coordinator in preparation to receive this Sacrament.

And, today is Fr. Floyd’s Birthday! Let us keep him in our prayers for best wishes and good health in the days ahead! And... please don’t forget our Parish Centennial Family picnic from 2-6pm today at the Mahwah Elks. Looking forward to seeing you all there!

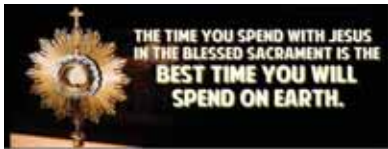

### **September 21 – Feast of St. Matthew**

At the time that Jesus summoned Matthew to follow Him, he was a publican., No one was more shunned by the Jews than a publican, who was a Jew working for the Roman enemy by robbing his own people (as a tax collector) and making a large personal profit. Publicans were not allowed to trade, eat, or even pray with other Jews. He was also regarded by the pharisees as the typical sinner. One day, while seated at his table of books and money, Jesus looked at Matthew and said two words: "Follow me." This was all that was needed to make Matthew rise, leaving his pieces of silver to follow Christ. **St. Matthew, the Evangelist** is the patron of accountants; bankers; bookkeepers; tax collectors;
