

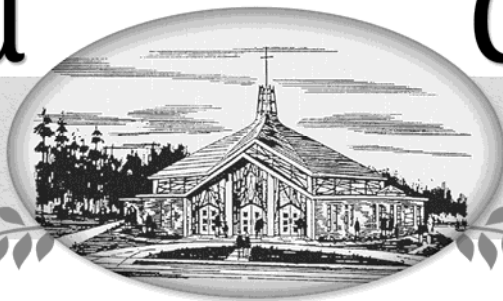

Message from the Pastor:

In today's Gospel Luke tells the beautiful story of Jesus' response to the sinful woman. In her love for Jesus, she disregards the usual way guests are treated at a banquet. She bathes Jesus' feet first with her tears, wipes them with her hair, kisses them and anoints them with precious ointment. Simon, the host of the banquet, shows Jesus none of the usual courtesies when He arrives. Moreover he condemns Jesus for associating with the woman who was a known sinner. In telling Simon a story about forgiving debts, Jesus praises the woman. She is forgiven because of her great love. Jesus points out Simon's need for forgiveness - his lack of hospitality, his lack of respect for each of them, and his self-righteousness. The story is a powerful example of the relationship between forgiveness and love.

Simon and his guests not only judge the sinful woman, but they also judge Jesus. They are indignant at Jesus assuming the power and authority to forgive sins. They fail to see who Jesus is: the One who came to bring the "good news of the kingdom of God." In this kingdom sinners touch God, receive forgiveness, and are granted peace. In this kingdom it is not tension and judgment that triumph, but it is love – God's love for us all.

As we continue in this Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy, Pope Francis has named this Sunday as Jubilee Sunday for those who are Ill and for Persons with Disabilities. In this, and in our 100th Jubilee Celebration, let's try to take some time out of our own personal schedules, especially during the summer months, to do what we can for those less fortunate than ourselves. Pope Francis calls for each of us to serve as the Saints served Jesus: "Mother Church teaches us to be close to those who are sick. Mother Church teaches us to give food and drink to those who are hungry and thirsty, to clothe those who are naked. Mother Church teaches us to be close to those who are neglected and alone. So many simple men and women, every day, practice works of mercy in a hospital, rest home or their own home.... Dear brothers and sisters, this is how the Church is Mother, by teaching her children works of mercy. She learned this manner from Jesus; she learned that this is what's essential for salvation. It's not enough to love those who love us. Jesus says that pagans do this. It's not enough to do good to those who do good to us. To change the world for the better it is necessary to do good to those who are not able to return the favor, as the Father has done with us, by giving us Jesus. How much have we paid for our redemption? Nothing, totally free! Doing good without expecting anything in return. This is what the Father did with us and we must do the same. Do good and carry on!"

As a reminder, next Sunday, June 19th is Father's Day. Envelopes are available for Mass intentions for all fathers who have cherished and nourished us throughout our life.

Please join me in congratulating Fr. Marek Bokota as he celebrates the 35th Anniversary of his Priestly Ordination on June 14th. May God's Providence and many Blessings be with him always in his ministry and all the days of his life.

“Did You Know?”

Holy Orders is a sacrament and no sacrament properly received is revocable, so a man is a priest forever. Celibacy is a voluntary solemn vow that is part of the Latin Rite of the Church. Since it is not part of the sacrament of Holy Orders, the Pope can give permission for a married man to become a priest in the Latin rite. This he has done for some married Protestant ministers who have converted, since the marriage came before the ordination. A priest who has been ordered by his Bishop to no longer function as a priest is called a “laicized” priest, not an “ex-priest”. He is still a priest but cannot work as one.
