

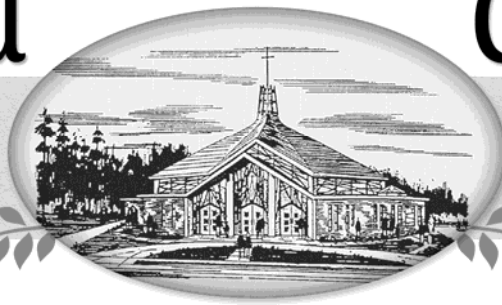

Message from the Pastor:

As we approach our nation's birthday holiday next weekend I would like to bring your attention to the time period from June 21st to July 4th called "Fortnight to Freedom." Each year dioceses around the country highlight the importance of defending religious freedom. Thought provoking material and a complete statement on our first most cherished liberty – religious liberty – can be found on the U.S. Conference of Catholics Bishops' website. I urge everyone to take a look at this information and speak frankly with each other when our freedoms are threatened. Our Bishops also "urge an intensification of your prayers and fasting for a new birth of freedom in our beloved country. We invite you to join us in an urgent prayer for religious liberty."

*Almighty God, Father of all nations,
for freedom you have set us free in Christ Jesus (Gal 5:1).
We praise and bless you for the gift of religious liberty,
the foundation of human rights, justice, and the common good.
Grant to our leaders the wisdom to protect and promote our liberties;
by your grace may we have the courage to defend them, for ourselves
and for all those who live in this blessed land.
We ask this through the intercession of Mary Immaculate, our patroness,
and in the name of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
with whom you live and reign, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.*

In today's Gospel of Luke, Jesus is "resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem" where His mission and ministry will be accomplished. But on the way He encounters a number of conflicts - He is not welcome in a Samaritan village, He rebukes disciples who want to take revenge, He predicts the lack of comfort and security for His followers, and He criticizes those who have excuses for not immediately following him. Jesus' harsh words toward those desiring to follow Him are not intended to be taken literally but are a way of expressing the importance of committing everything to the Lord, as did Elisha in the first reading. Jesus is saying that nothing must stand in the way of our commitment to God. We need to take care of our families and social responsibilities but they cannot become obstacles to, or prevent us, from committing ourselves to building and establishing God's Kingdom. We all must be deeply aware of the inevitable conflicts that will arise when we follow Jesus on our journey to eternal life.

Let us continue to pray for peace throughout the world and especially for the innocent victims in Orlando. "Pope Francis joins the families of the victims and all of the injured in prayer and in compassion. Sharing in their indescribable suffering he entrusts them to the Lord so they may find comfort. We all hope that ways may be found, as soon as possible, to effectively identify and contrast the causes of such terrible and absurd violence which so deeply upsets the desire for peace of the American people and of the whole of humanity."

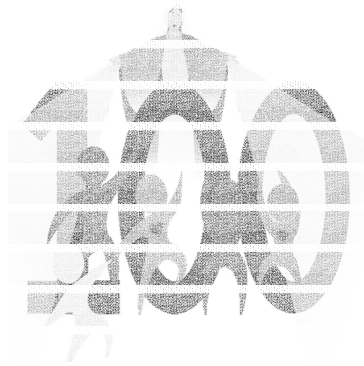

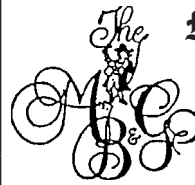
