

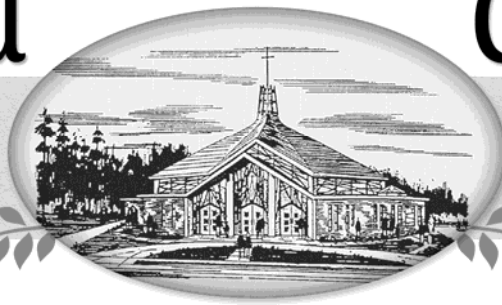

“Immaculate Heart of Mary”

Historically, devotion to the Heart of Mary grew up in parallel, but at a lesser intensity than that of devotion to the Heart of Jesus. It actually intensified in the mid 1600's when St. John Eudes brought people to love Christ and the Virgin Mary by speaking tirelessly about their Heart and composing Masses and Offices in their honor.

But it was not until after the Apparitions at *Rue du Bac* concerning the “Miraculous Medal” made to Catherine Laboure in 1830, and the establishment of a society dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, at the Church of Our Lady of Victories in Paris in 1836, that this particular devotion became really well known.

Since then the devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, has gradually grown more widespread in the Church, particularly since the apparitions at Fatima, in 1917.

This devotion to Mary's heart is essentially concerned with the love that her heart has for Jesus, for God. It is a model for how we should love God. The fact that her heart is immaculate, that is sinless, means that she is the only human person who is able to really love God in the way that he should be loved. The aim of the devotion is to unite mankind to God through Mary's heart.

Canon Law requires that our churches be dedicated and give a title of (1) the name of the Trinity, or (2) the name of Christ, or (3) the name of the Holy Spirit, or (4) the name of Mary, or (5) the name of Angels, or (6) the name of a canonized Saint in the Roman Martyrology, or (7) the name of a Blessed provided the Apostolic See has given it's permission. Canon Law also leaves it to the diocesan bishop to establish parishes and to name them.

Therefore, it is very interesting that on September 14, 1915 permission was granted by the Most Reverend John J. O'Connor, Bishop of Newark to establish a Parish under the patronage of “The Immaculate Heart of Mary”. Then in May 1916 when at the official dedication of the building, the Salesian Bishop presided.

FYI: The answer to September's question “What is a Sacramental?” is:

A sacramental is anything set apart or blessed by the Church to excite good thoughts and to increase devotion and through these movements of the heart, to remit venial sin. Examples of sacramentals might be: holy water, a rosary, medals, statues of saints, holy cards, scapulas and making the sign of the cross.

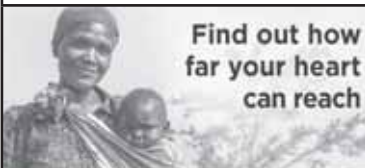

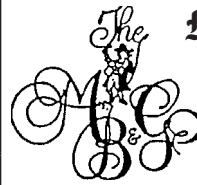
