

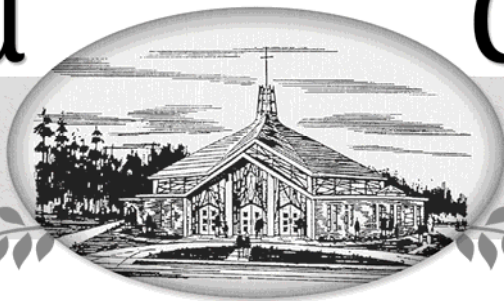

Message from the Pastor:

October 30, 2016

Today is Priesthood Sunday. Since the formation of our Parish over 100 years ago, prayer has been an integral part of devout family life resulting in a number of vocations from our Parish. We especially pray for Fr. Lou Molinelli, son of our parishioner, Mary, and the late Louis Molinelli, and for many more vocations from our youth in the days to come. Remember, prayer begins at home from the earliest age and it becomes part of us throughout our life!

In today's Gospel of Luke we hear about the encounter of Jesus and Zacchaeus. Jesus did not intend to stop in Jericho but Zacchaeus, who was seeking to see who Jesus was, ran and climbed a sycamore tree because of his short stature. Jesus responds to Zacchaeus' enthusiasm by doing for him the very thing Jesus came to do: "to seek out and to save what was lost." Their dramatic encounter brings out something about each of them which escaped the grumbling crowd: Zacchaeus is open to being changed through an encounter with Jesus; Jesus is the One who inspires the kind of change that leads to salvation. We are to be just as uninhibited and enthusiastic about encountering Jesus and just as willing to be changed by Him. The challenge of this Gospel is allow Jesus to come close enough to us to have a lasting effect!

This Tuesday, Nov. 1st, we will celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, remembering all the Saints known and unknown to us who enjoy the glory of heaven. In the Gospel of Matthew, we listen to the Beatitudes, which are guidelines for true joy and the attainment of sanctity in our own Christian lives. Our Mass schedule is as follows: Vigil Mass on Monday, Oct. 31st at 7:30pm, and on Tues, Nov. 1st at 8am, 12 noon and 7pm in Polish.

On Wednesday, Nov. 2nd, we will celebrate the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. In addition to our three earlier Masses at 8am, 9am in Polish, and 12 noon, we celebrate our annual Mass of Remembrance at 7pm for those who have passed away this year from our Parish as well as for All Souls. We will continue to pray throughout the month for those remembered on All Souls' envelopes and all Mass Intentions.

As of today, our current contract with the company that prints our Bulletin has ended and we have signed with a new company that will offer us 4/color printing throughout for no additional cost as well as 2 extra pages! We are working hard on bringing you an exciting and colorful Bulletin that will be informative as well as useful in your daily life.
