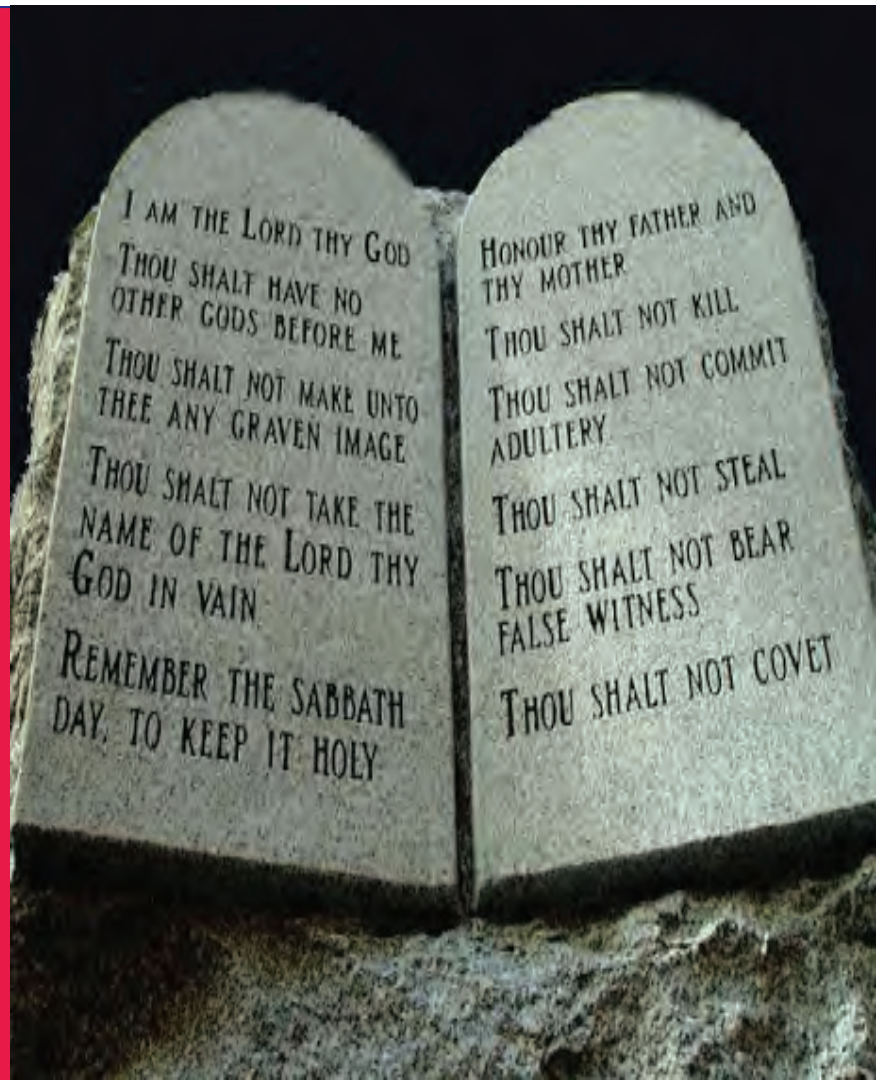

Message from the Pastor:

In today's lengthy passage of the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus replies to those who have accused Him of doing away with the tradition of the law and the prophets. He states that He intends to fulfill the law. His words are emphatic and He employs a repeating technique to make his point by using the phrase, "You have heard that it was said, ... But I say to you." Using four examples from Mosaic law He offers an interpretation that goes beyond the mere letter of the law. He wants his listeners to live the law from their hearts, not just from external obligations.

Jesus sees in the law the means to the fulfillment of time "... until all things have taken place", when the law will be replaced by righteous relationships within the kingdom of heaven. The fundamental law is the gift of self to others. When self-giving is lacking in any act of keeping the law, the law in fact is not kept. We are to keep the law as the way to enter a manner of caring for, and relating to others, that leads to fullness of Life. Our model for so doing is Jesus. In relationships, we don't choose to fall in love, it just happens. But staying in love requires constant choosing, that what just happened by chance and grace, becomes pattern and commitment. The same is true for the fundamental law of self-giving, which is really a fundamental law of love.

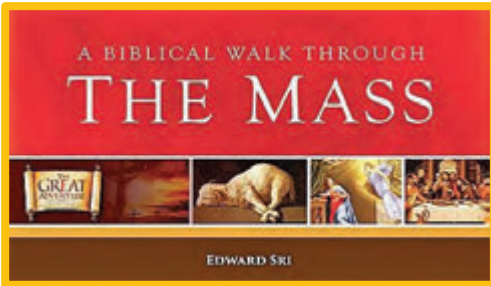
Speaking of love, during the period from Feb. 7th to Feb. 14th, Valentine's Day, we celebrate National Marriage Week, and today, we celebrate National Marriage Day for all married couples. Archbishop Charles J. Chaput of Philadelphia, in a recent letter to his brother Bishops stated "Marriage, both as a natural institution and as a Christian sacrament, is an irreplaceable good for society and all people." Let us therefore salute, honor and pray for all married couples, for their love, for their families, for the beauty of their faithfulness, sacrifice and joy in daily married life.

You blessed the union of married couples
so that they might reflect the union of Christ with his Church:
look with kindness on them.
Renew their marriage covenant,
increase your love in them,
and strengthen their bond of peace
so that, with their children,
they may always rejoice in the gift of your blessing.
We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.*

ST. VALENTINE

February 14

Patron of Love and Happy Marriages



St. Valentine, a Roman Priest, is a third-century saint and associated with "courtly love." Although not much of his life is reliably known, it is agreed that he refused to renounce his faith and Christianity and he was martyred and buried north of Rome, on Feb, 14th, 269.

There are many depictions of St. Valentine's death; one telling he was beheaded by the emperor Claudius II for helping Christian couples wed; another telling for secretly marrying couples so their husbands wouldn't have to go to war. Another legend says he refused to sacrifice to pagan gods, was imprisoned and while imprisoned he healed the jailer's blind daughter. On the day of his execution, he left the girl a note signed, "Your Valentine." Whoever he was, Valentine did really exist, because archaeologists have unearthed a Roman catacomb and an ancient church dedicated to St. Valentine. In 496 AD, Pope Gelasius marked Feb. 14th honor of his martyrdom. In 1969, the Roman Catholic Church removed St. Valentine from the General Roman Calendar, because so little is known about him. However, the church still recognizes him as a saint, listing him in the Feb. 14 spot of Roman Martyrology.

SAINTS CYRIL AND METHODIUS

February 14

Saints Cyril and Methodius (826-869, 815-885) were two brothers who were Byzantine Christian theologians and Christian missionaries. Through their work, they influenced the cultural development of all Slavs, for which they received the title "Apostles to the Slavs". They are credited with devising the Glagolitic alphabet, the first alphabet used to transcribe *Old Church Slavonic*. After their deaths, their pupils continued their missionary work among other Slavs. Both brothers are venerated in the Orthodox Church as saints with the title of "equal-to-apostles". In 1880, Pope Leo XIII introduced their Feast into the Roman calendar. In 1980, Pope John Paul II declared them co-patron saints of Europe.

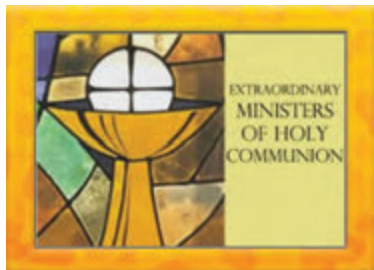
One of my happiest days was watching that class make their First Holy Communion.

We are also learning the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy, and how they apply to our daily lives. I love the enthusiasm that the children have, and look forward to every class.
