## "I do will it. Be made clean."

In today's Gospel of Mark, Jesus, by touching the leper, takes on the leper's ritual uncleanness. Consequently, he must remain an outcast, living in "deserted places." But this does not stop the people from "coming to him from everywhere." In Jesus, they recognize someone who freely and fearlessly touches everything that is human. They cannot stay away from someone who draws this close to them.

Can we?

This Wednesday, February 14<sup>th</sup>, we celebrate not only Valentine's Day, but Ash Wednesday! While Valentine's Day is a day important for us to show everyone we love and care about how important they are to us, Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. It is a season of penance, reflection, and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday, through which we attain Redemption! The Ashes, made from palms blessed on the previous year's Palm Sunday and marked in the sign of the cross on our foreheads, are a symbol of penance made sacramental by the blessing of the Church, and they help us develop a spirit of humility and sacrifice. Let us begin these 40 days till Easter here at our Masses and Ash Distribution on Ash Wednesday and our Parish Missions immediately following. I assure you, our dynamic Retreat leaders, will help prepare us for this time of self-examination and draw us closer to our Risen Lord on Easter Sunday.

Our Parish Missions are as follows: Polish: Ash Wednesday, February 14<sup>th</sup> through Saturday, evening, February 17<sup>th</sup> at 7:30pm with Fr. Michał Olszewski; English: Saturday, February 17<sup>th</sup> at the 5pm Mass, all Sunday Masses and Monday through Wednesday, February 19<sup>th</sup> to February 21<sup>st</sup> at 7pm with the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal from Newburgh, NY. Immediately following our Parish Missions, we will facilitate stimulating small Faith-Sharing groups with *"Live Lent – Don't just observe Lent. Live it!"* – a series of discussions of going deeper into the Sunday Gospel readings during Lent and exploring old testament insights. Please sign-up by Sunday, Feb. 18<sup>th</sup>, so that we can order the right amount of materials for 5 weeks of evening Faith-Sharing groups held in Rectory offices and share your thoughts and beliefs for a more fulfilling Lenten experience!

Today, Sunday, February 11<sup>th</sup>, we celebrate World Marriage Day. Let us congratulate and continue to pray for all married couples – the union of man and woman that Christ raised to the dignity of a Sacrament! All married couples will receive a special Blessing at all Masses and those married 25+ years will receive a red rose in honor of their commitment to God and each other!

### ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2018 LENTEN REGULATIONS



1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the Fast on Good Friday is continued to the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**

Those between ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence “substantially”, or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty\*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 18, 2018 to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 27, 2018.**

\*Canon 920, §1. *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

The monk was previously in diocese of Kielce. Michał has also authored many books: *Live in the Holy Spirit; God gives charisms; Be like Job. God's experience in a crisis; To be a disciple of the Lord. Proclaim, heal, free; Accept His call.
