

**DAY 1 – REVELATION 10:1-6**

1. What did you find new and/or interesting from the lecture?
2. How does the description of the angel who held the small scroll resemble descriptions of Jesus/God from previous chapters of Revelation?
3.
  - a. The land in verse 2 represents Israel, while the sea represents the Gentiles. Why would the angel have a foot on both as he proclaims his message?
  - b. What does his voice resemble? (See Hos 11:10; Am 1:2)
4. The seven thunders represented the voice of God. List the sevenfold effects and qualities of the Lord's voice from Psalm 29:4-9.
5.
  - a. In verse 4, what was John about to do and how did heaven change his plan?
  - b. Describe an experience when your plans have been changed through prayer. **(Personal)**
6.
  - a. The angel swore an oath in verses 5-6. What is an oath? (See CCC 2150)
  - b. Why shouldn't an oath be used for trivial matters? (See CCC 2155)

**DAY 2 – REVELATION 10:5-11**

7.
  - a. As the angel raised his right hand to heaven, what did he proclaim?
  - b. What do you think the mysterious plan of God, fulfilled at the sound of the 7th trumpet, is? (See Rv 11:15)
8.
  - a. What was John commanded to do with the scroll?
  - b. What are we to do with the Word of God? (See Jer 15:16; Rom 10:8; Col 3:16)
  - c. How can consuming the Word provide nourishment for your soul?
9.
  - a. What did John experience as he consumed the scroll?
  - b. How has the Word of God been sweet and bitter to you? **(Personal)**
10. Read Ezekiel 2:8-3:14 for a similar account. What was written on this scroll?
11.
  - a. What mission were both John and Ezekiel given after eating the scroll?
  - b. With what mission does God charge those who receive His Word today? (See CCC 904-905)

**DAY 3 – REVELATION 11:1-5**

12. What was John asked to measure and count?

13. a. Why was the outer court excluded from measurement?
- b. What did Jesus prophesy about the trampling of Jerusalem by the Gentiles? (See Lk 21:20-24)
- c. How are Christians being “trampled” by unbelievers today?
14. a. What will the two witnesses do during the 3½ years?
- b. Sackcloth was an outward form of penance used in the Old Testament. What is the primary purpose of penance? (See CCC 1430)
- c. Why is penance a necessary step in the Sacrament of Reconciliation? (See CCC 1459-1460)
15. How does John, in today’s verses, borrow from the imagery in Zechariah 4:11-14?
16. How will God protect the witnesses during the 3½ years?

#### **DAY 4 – REVELATION 11:5-10**

17. a. How are the powers given to the two witnesses similar to the powers demonstrated by Moses and Elijah? (See Ex 7:14-18; 2 Kgs 1:10; Jas 5:17-18)
- b. Where do we meet Moses and Elijah again in the New Testament? (See Mt 17:1-8)
18. a. Who will kill the two witnesses and from where does it come?
- b. The enemy seems to win. How does the prophecy in Daniel 7:19-22 offer hope as to the final outcome?
19. What is a possible identity of the “great city”? (See Ps 79:1-4; Jer 23:14)
20. a. According to verse 10, how did the witnesses’ testimonies affect the inhabitants of the earth?
- b. How can the truth torment?

#### **DAY 5 – REVELATION 11:11-14**

21. a. What happened to the two witnesses 3½ days after their death?
- b. What does the breath of God symbolize? (See CCC 691)
22. a. What did the voice from heaven command the two witnesses to do?
- b. How does this point to the resurrection of the dead? (See CCC 990)
23. How do the events in verses 7-13 parallel Jesus’ death, Resurrection and Ascension?
24. How might the two witnesses symbolize the Church?
