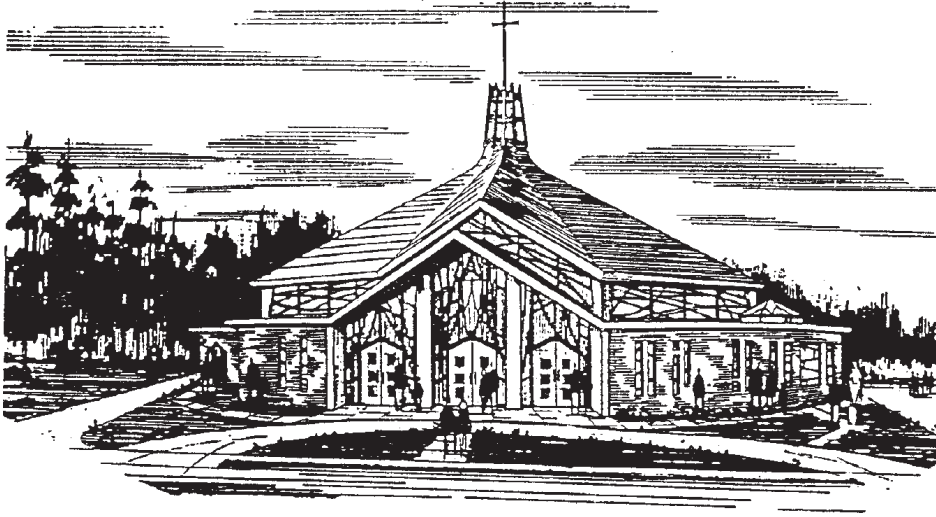

Message from the Pastor:

The first reading today from the Book of Wisdom shows God to be the Lord of life, not of death. God made human beings in his own likeness - that is, eternal. But spiritual death occurs when we are separated from God. Do we have the faith to touch and be touched by Jesus so that whatever is dead within us may be restored to life? God “fashioned all things that they might have being,” that is, life; whereas death reveals the power of evil at work in the world. Jesus overcomes death with a healing power that brings full, abundant life.

In today’s Gospel imagine the grief of the father of the little girl who is dying. Think of a critical situation in your life or in the life of someone you know. Like Jairus, you pray, “Jesus, please come.” Jesus is with you and those you love in every situation. He will give you what you need - whether it is forgiveness and peace, new paths or solutions for critical issues or situations, or more patience or kindness and so on. When you ask Jesus to come, he comes! And when he comes, he brings you new life.

Call to Action – “Care for our Common Home”!

Recently, on May 24th, our Holy Father, published the Encyclical Letter “Laudato Si’ on Care for our Common Home.” Pope Francis opens the Letter as follows: “*LAUDATO SI’, mi’ Signore*” – “*Praise be to you, my Lord*”. In the words of this beautiful canticle, Saint Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. “Praise be to you, my Lord, through our Sister, Mother Earth, who sustains and governs us, and who produces various fruit with coloured flowers and herbs”.

I would like to invite everyone to a “study and sharing group” to discuss this special document in more detail and how it could impact our personal lives as well as what we can do as a Parish to “Care for our Common Home”. I guarantee these will be thought provoking sessions in which we all will have “new ideas and revelations” to share! We will schedule morning and evening sessions on **Mondays, 8:30-9:30am or 6-7pm, July 6th, 13th, 20th and 27th** in the **Rectory meeting rooms**.
