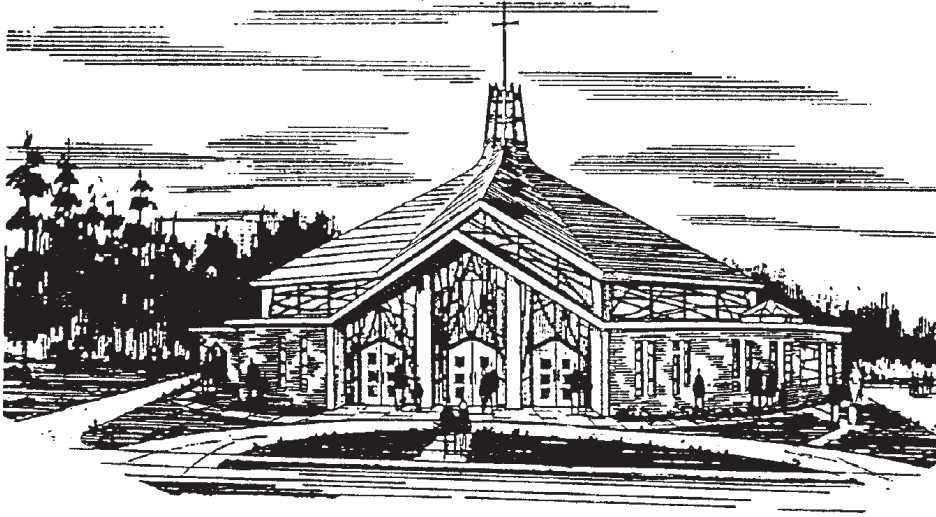

## Message from the Pastor:

As Pope Francis wrapped up his apostolic journey to Latin America last week he took time out on Sunday to meet with the youth of Asuncion, Paraguay. Two young people, named Manuel and Liz, shared witness to their lives. In response, Pope Francis said to them: "You both show great goodness and courage. You have shared the greatest treasure which you have: your stories, your lives and how Jesus became a part of them. You also shared how you have tried to move forward - where you found strength. Both of you said it was in your parish - in your friends from the parish and the spiritual retreats organized there. These two things are key: friends and spiritual retreats."

"Friends: Friendship is one of the greatest gifts which a person, a young person, can have and can offer. It really is. How hard it is to live without friends! Think about it: isn't that one of the most beautiful things that Jesus tells us? He says: "I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you" (*Jn 15:15*). One of the most precious things about our being Christians is that we are friends, friends of Jesus. When you love someone, you spend time with them, you watch out for them and you help them, you tell them what you are thinking, but also you never abandon them. That's how Jesus is with us; he never abandons us. Friends stand by one another, they help one another, they protect another. The Lord is like that with us. He is patient with us."

"Spiritual retreats: Saint Ignatius has a famous meditation on the two standards. He describes the standard of the devil and then the standard of Christ. It would be like the football jerseys of two different teams. And he asks us which team we want to play for. In this meditation, he has us imagine: What it would be like to belong to one or the other team. As if he was saying to us: "In this life, which team do you want to play for? Saint Ignatius says that the devil, in order to recruit players, promises that those who play on his side will receive riches, honor, glory and power. They will be famous. Everyone will worship them. Then, Ignatius tells us the way Jesus plays. His game is not something fantastic. Jesus doesn't tell us that we will be stars, celebrities, in this life. Instead, he tells us that playing with him is about humility, love, service to others."

In today's Gospel, Mark tells us the crowds are relentless in pursuing Jesus and the disciples. They do not even give them time to rest. What, however, are the crowds really pursuing? And, what is it that Jesus begins to teach them? Jesus knows there is more to satisfying human needs than miracles. Jesus responds to the crowd as their healer, yes. But even more, He reveals himself to be their Shepherd and Teacher who challenges the crowd about what they are truly to pursue.

Like the disciples, we need to recognize that there is a time for rest and a need for spiritual retreats. In the next couple of weeks, we will be outlining activities taking place in our own Parish for our spiritual enrichment as the Pope embarks on his next apostolic journey to the USA for the World Meeting of Families in Philadelphia, Sept. 22<sup>nd</sup>-25<sup>th</sup> as well as the kick-off of our own Parish Centennial Jubilee celebration on Oct. 11<sup>th</sup>.

### July 22 Feast of St. Mary Magdalene

St. Mary was given the name 'Magdalen' because, though a Jewish girl, she lived in a Gentile town called Magdale. Her culture and manners were those of a Gentile. Mary Magdalen was well known as a sinner when she first saw Our Lord. She was very beautiful and very proud, but after she met Jesus, she felt great sorrow for her evil life. Jesus seeing into Mary's repentant heart, said "Many sins are forgiven her, because she has loved very much"; and to Mary He said "Your faith has made you safe; go in peace."

When Our Lord was crucified, Mary was there at the foot of His cross. On Easter morning at the tomb not finding the body of Jesus she wept. Jesus, Risen from the dead, chose to show Himself *first* to Mary, the repentant sinner.
