

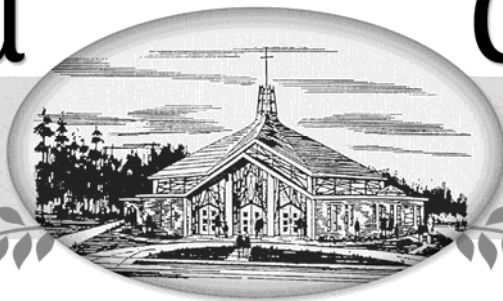

Message from the Pastor:

As a reminder, while we pray for the deceased throughout the year, especially on All Souls Day and the anniversary of their death, the Church has designated the whole month of November to commemorate All Holy Souls and we should devote some time each day this month to pray for all souls – from those closest to us to the most forsaken. A short prayer we can all pray:

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

In today's Gospel of Mark, we hear Jesus warned the crowd of about hypocrites – “Beware of the scribes who like to go around in long robes and accept greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honor in synagogues, and places of honor at banquets.” The religious leaders failed to show or appreciate the kind of compassion expected of God's ambassadors to the poor. Their religious practice was only for show and self-aggrandizement. Jesus went on to observe the crowd and how they contributed to the treasury. Many rich people gave large sums and a poor widow gave only a few cents. Jesus tells us in this Gospel, that although the woman only gave a few coins, her contribution in God's eyes was of more value than those who gave many coins. The others gave of their surplus, while she sacrificed to be able to give what she did. Nothing is more moving to the heart of Jesus than our willingness and sacrifice to give of ourselves with both our time and treasure to help others less fortunate than ourselves.

The Centennial Spirituality Committee is offering Bible Studies on the Gospel of Luke beginning Monday, November 9th. These sessions will be held every Monday for 6 weeks at 8:30am and 7pm. Please sign up on the enclosed sheet and drop off at Rectory. I assure you these studies will be both enlightening and revealing as we strive to become closer to Jesus in our daily life.

On Wednesday, Nov. 11th at 12 noon, everyone is invited for a special Healing Mass. Special prayers will be offered for anyone in need of physical, spiritual, or emotional healing and all those that attend will also receive the Sacrament of Anointing.

I would also like to remind everyone that this Sunday, Nov. 8th at 2pm, in our Parish Hall, the Jubilee Celebration Committee will be presenting an interesting event featuring the life and legacy of local Mahwah poet and patriot Joyce Kilmer. Alex Michelini will narrate this lecture on Kilmer's poetry including his “Trees” fame, his conversion to Catholicism, and his heroic death in World War I in a special program for all to enjoy. Hope to see you all there! Hope you all are enjoying the “Indian Summer” that we have been blessed with this past week. Thanks be to God for these beautiful days!

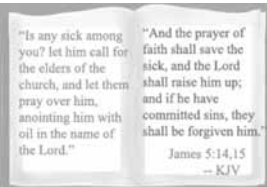
