

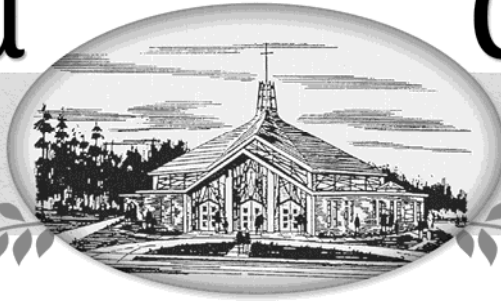

Message from the Pastor:

For as long as I can remember, once Nov. 15th came around, days flew by like a whirlwind till year-end! Next Sunday, Nov. 22nd, we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, followed by Thanksgiving later that week and then Advent beginning on Sunday, Nov. 29th. And on it goes - to Christmas and New Year's - yes, we are fast approaching the end of 2015!

But in today's Gospel of Mark, Jesus talks about another end that is near. In this reading we look forward to the day of Jesus' second coming. We do not know the day or the hour of His coming; only God knows. Jesus tells us "Learn a lesson from the fig tree." The annual greening of the fig tree is a harbinger of new life arising out of seeming deadness. The annual Gospel prediction of apocalyptic destruction is a harbinger that Jesus "is near." Jesus has repeatedly taught us we must watch and wait for Him in faith, hope, and love. In the hour we least expect Him, He warns, He will come. Let us pray in today's liturgy for ourselves and for the whole Church, that the Lord may find us ready when He returns. Let us not live in fear but await His kingdom with hope as we strive to do God's will here on earth.

As I write this message, earlier in the week, we have begun construction in our Church alcove for shrines to house the relics and commemorate St. John Bosco, founder of the Salesian Order, and St. John Paul II, the 264th Pope from 1978 till his death in 2005. We just recently celebrated the 200th Anniversary of St. John Bosco's birthday this past August 16th and the Feast of St. John Paul II on October 22nd, the Anniversary of his inauguration to the Pontificate. As you all know, both of these Saints had a great love and devotion to our Blessed Mother and these shrines will be a most fitting inclusion in our Church! By this weekend I hope it to be almost completed. Please take a look and say a special prayer to them while you're here.

I would like to remind everyone that the Centennial Spirituality Committee is offering Bible Studies on the Gospel of Luke. These sessions will be held every Monday at 8:30am ending Dec. 14th. You can still sign-up at the Rectory. I assure you these studies will be enlightening and revealing as Advent approaches and we strive to become closer to Jesus in our daily life.

I would also like to thank Jubilee Celebration Committee and Alex Michelini for the interesting program he put on last Sunday on the life and legacy of local Mahwah poet and patriot Joyce Kilmer. It was most informative on his life's story, and for those who missed it, I recommend contacting Alex and the Joyce Kilmer Society.

And please don't forget next Saturday night, Nov. 21st is our International Night Dinner Dance. It promises to be a night of great camaraderie, great fun, great music and outstanding food. Hope to see you all there.
