

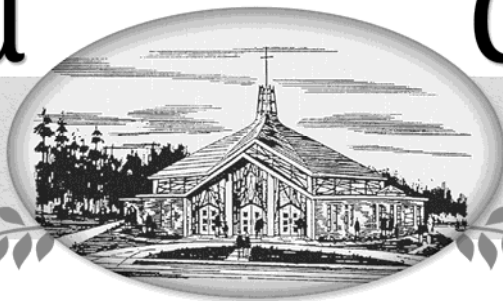

Message from the Pastor:

In last Sunday's Gospel of Luke, we heard Jesus preaching in the synagogue in Nazareth. In today's Gospel, Luke continues to tell us the people do not listen to Jesus. They did not believe He was the Messiah because they had known Him all their lives. While the people were impressed by His preaching, they could not accept that it came from someone familiar to them. They believed Jesus was "Joseph's son" and nothing more. They wanted more proof. Jesus reminded them that God does not act in the way we expect by giving them a number of examples. Hearing these words challenges the people, and for this, they reject Jesus and want to destroy Him. Yet God, whose word Jesus speaks, delivers Him. "Jesus passed through the midst of them and went away." Jesus knew that his Father was with Him always as He continued on His mission.

In today's First Reading, we hear the Lord choosing Jeremiah to be his prophet. Knowing the challenges that faced God's prophets, Jeremiah tells the Lord all the reasons he would not be a good prophet but our Lord promises Jeremiah that He will always be at his side and never abandon him. The people also did not listen to Jeremiah but he never gave up because he knew the Lord was with him. Following God's path is never easy but as God tells Jeremiah "They will fight against you but not prevail over you, for I am with you to deliver you."

This week on Tuesday, February 2nd, we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This Feast commemorates the observance of the Law of Moses where Mary and Joseph present Jesus in the Temple to consecrate Him to the Lord.

On Wednesday, February 3rd, we celebrate the Memorial of St. Blaise, Bishop and martyr. His Feast is commemorated with the blessing of throats; as legend says, he cured a young boy choking on a fish bone. The Blessing of Throats will take place after our 8am and noon Mass.

I would also like to remind everyone that today, Sunday, January 31st at 3pm, in the Parish Hall, our Family Spirituality Committee and Youth Group will host a Family Movie Matinee "UP". Please be sure to join us for a fun-filled afternoon. Free admission with a "Can of Soup" donation.

And speaking of donations, please don't forget our "SOUP-ER BOWL OF CARING" Soup Drive. Help us make 2016 a record year that supports our local Food Center in Mahwah. Place your cans of soup in the "soup pot" located in the church and school lobbies through Sunday, February 7th.

I'm praying that our *blizzard* last Saturday (26.9" in NYC Central Park - off by .10" in *breaking the record*) will be enough to last us for this winter and keep our skiers happy!

I'd like to close with this passage from our Second Reading - I Corinthians 13:13:

"So faith, hope, love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love."
