

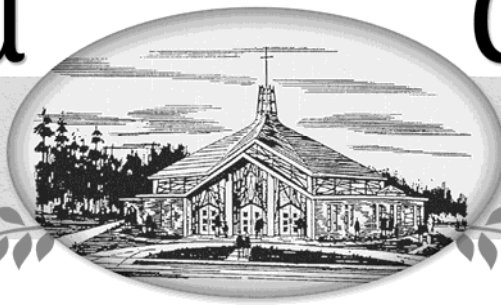

Message from the Pastor:

Today, the third Sunday of Lent, we continue on our Lenten journey. In the first part of today's Gospel of Luke, we hear that some people in Jesus' time believed that those who suffered tragedies and injustices were being punished because they were great sinners. However, Jesus tells them "By no means!" and goes on "But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!" Strong words by Jesus, but a clear message.

Jesus goes on to tell the parable of the fig tree. This parable reminds us that God is very patient. The owner of the fig tree only cares about whether the tree bears fruit - he has no regard for the tree and its life. The gardener, on the other hand, cares about the fig tree, sees the life still there, and wants to give it every chance to produce. He understands that as long as there's life, there's potential to bear fruit. What wastes away life within us and prevents us from bearing fruit is sin. Jesus is willing to help us, as the man was willing to give the tree extra help so that it would grow. Repentance for our sins means choosing to nurture new life and all the fullness it can bring. Change in our lives means hard work. Deepening our relationship with God and others takes hard work as well. The discipline of Lent includes this kind of hard work repentance which leads to the new life Easter promises.

By now, everyone should have received my letter on the upcoming "We Are Living Stones" campaign. If you haven't already signed up for one of the receptions in our Parish Hall, starting this week on Wednesday evening, March 2nd at 7pm, I hope that you will do so at this time. There will be two additional receptions, one following the noon Mass on Monday, March 7th celebrated by our Archbishop Bernard Hebda, and the last one on Wednesday, March 9th at 7pm. We would appreciate if everyone would RSVP - even last minute - by phone, email or fax to our Rectory office or drop in the collection basket so that we can plan for the attendance for each reception date. Together, and with prayer, we will learn more specifics about this campaign and in achieving our goal of helping those in need and our Parish needs as well.

As we continue on our Lenten Journey, please mark your calendars for a "Morning of Reflection", on Saturday, March 12th, 10am - 12 noon, here in our Church. Fr. Mark-David Janus, CSP, PhD, President of Paulist Press, will lead us in a Lenten Reflection on God's Mercy in our life's journey. Editor of *Crossing the Threshold of Mercy: A Spiritual Guide for the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy*, this collection of short inspirational excerpts will also help encourage us to leave behind doubt and fear and allow God's love to embrace us. Light refreshments will also be served afterwards with time for personal chatting with Fr. Janus!

It seems that time is truly flying by, and I'm sure everyone, like me, cannot believe that March begins this Tuesday! Just think - Spring is now just around the corner! Have a wonderful week.
