

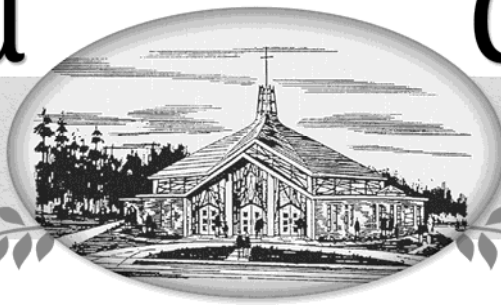

Message from the Pastor:

About ten days ago, our Archbishop, Most Reverend John J. Myers, released a new pastoral letter titled **“To Whom Shall We Go?”** reflecting on the spiritual nature of the human person and the role of God’s grace in guiding us to live in today’s world according to His plan. “The human person senses a longing for a knowledge of and relationship with the transcendent being, a Someone beyond self-awareness,” the Archbishop writes. **“To Whom Shall We Go?”** encourages the reader to give priority to the spiritual dimension of the human person and to join with others outside of the celebration of Sunday Eucharist in order to find support and encouragement in living our calling as disciples. A full copy of this reflection can be found on our Archdiocesan website, rcan.org, and I encourage everyone to take some time to read and ponder his message.

In today’s Gospel of Luke, we hear how Jesus is welcomed into the home of his friends, Martha and Mary. The hostess, Martha, was tending to all the serving. Rather than being truly hospitable, she is “anxious and worried” only about accomplishing the tasks. Busy about herself, she misses the “better part”: centering on Jesus. When Martha complains to Jesus that she is doing all the work, Jesus tells her that she has forgotten the most important thing. She has neglected to listen to Jesus, whose words are more nourishing than any meal.

In the First Reading from the Book of Genesis, Abraham exhibited true hospitality. All of his efforts and busyness were directed toward the presence of his guests and their comfort and needs. This is what Martha in the Gospel failed to do: keep the people at the heart of hospitality. Even though we are very busy at times, we need to take time to listen to Jesus. Most of our lives are a combination of Martha and Mary. However, if our lives are like Martha’s all the time, they may be out of balance. We may be missing the “better” part. The “better part” is to be undividedly present to the person of Jesus – even when tending to the busyness of our lives and serving others!

I would like to ask everyone to place all Prayer Intentions & Petitions in the slot in the kneeler in front of the Black Madonna rather than leaving them in various spots around the Church. All intentions and petitions will then be placed on the altar and offered up during morning Mass every Saturday.

Let us continue to pray for peace throughout the world but especially for all the victims of gun violence here in our own country. In the words of St. John Paul II let us appeal to the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

***“Holy Mother, Mother of the Prince of Peace, help us!
Mother of Humanity and Queen of Peace, pray for us!”***

Feast Day of St. Mary Magdalene, July 22nd

Pope Francis' decision to elevate her memorial to a
feast during the Jubilee of Mercy, was done to
emphasize the importance of this woman, "who so
loved Christ and was so greatly loved by Christ." (CNA)

Except for the mother of Jesus, few women are more
honored in the Bible than Mary Magdalene. She was
one of those who stood by the cross of Jesus with his
mother. And, of all the "official" witnesses that might
have been chosen for the first awareness of the
Resurrection, she was the one to whom that privilege
was given. Using a phrase coined by St. Thomas
Aquinas, Archbishop Roche hailed St. Mary Magdalene,
as "the Apostle to the Apostles" because she
"announces to the apostles what in turn they will
announce to the whole world." (Am.Catholic.org)

*So they (Mary Magdalene and the other Mary)
departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great
joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹And behold, Jesus met
them and said, "Greetings!" And they came up and
took hold of his feet and worshiped him. ¹⁰Then Jesus
said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my
brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me."*

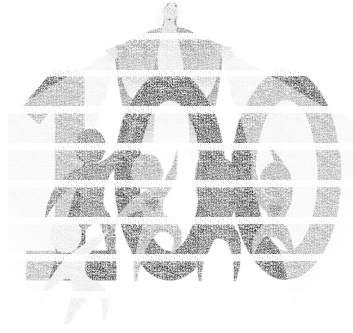

Go to www.Catholic.org, click on Catholic online, type in your question and hit Search for the answer.

FYI: The answer to June’s question “In 1983 Pope John Paul II made sweeping changes in the canonization process. What three steps were adopted? They are:

First: After the candidate’s death, a local bishop investigates a candidate’s life and writings. His findings are sent to a panel of theologians and the Cardinals of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints.

Second: A miracle thought to occur through the intercession of the candidate leads to “beatification” which implies that he/she is in heaven.

Third: After evidence of a second miracle is verified, the Pope canonizes the candidate as saint.

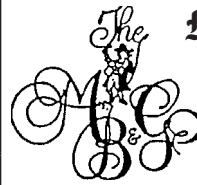
