

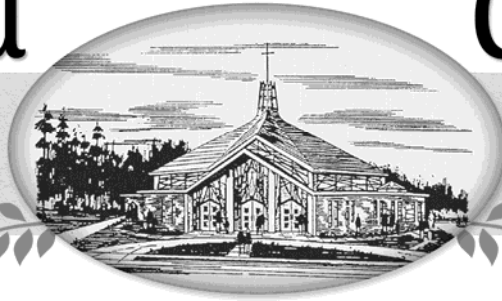

Message from the Pastor:

As I began to write my message for this weekend, which I need to have completed by Tuesday of the prior week, there seems to be no getting away from my contemplation, praying and writing about the continual violence in the world today. Whether here at home, with the most recent senseless murders of law officers in Baton Rouge and Dallas or innocent victims in Orlando or the local people and vacationers celebrating their national holiday in Nice, France, Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz, President of the USCCB, has recently stated the following which says it for all of us: “The darkness of violence cannot dim the light of humanity's highest aspirations to live in peace. For the dead, we ask for God's mercy. For the wounded, we ask for God's healing. For the affected families, we ask for God's strength. And for the rest of us, let us ask for God's wisdom as we seek the best way to help in the days ahead.” He continues: “These growing storms of hatred may test our ability to see the best in each other, but Jesus has already secured for us the victory of life over death, love over hate. In His confidence, let us move forward without fear, but with an open embrace of all people who share in the hope of peace and freedom being celebrated yesterday (Bastille Day). In this way, we isolate the forces of hate, starve its growth and shine the light of love into its darkest corners.”

As Youth groups, along with families and pastoral leaders, prepare for their pilgrimages to the **World Youth Day in Krakow** – from the opening Mass, Tuesday, July 26th to the closing Mass, Sunday, July 31st – let us pray for their safe journey and that they may experience the power and beauty of God's love and mercy with whom all they will encounter from around the world in His Universal Church. **Here at IHM, we will pray in unity** with them beginning at the **8am Mass, Friday, July 29th**, followed by the **Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 8:30am. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed through Friday night with Closing Prayers and Benediction on Saturday at 3pm.** Additionally, there will be a **Mass for all our Youth with a Social Hour to follow on Friday evening at 7pm** and a **Prayer Service in Polish at 9pm** in the Church. In the words of Pope Francis when he declared Krakow the location for this celebration:

“May Saintly Pope John Paul II, the Patron of World Youth Day, intercede on behalf of our pilgrimage toward his beloved Krakow. And may the maternal gaze of the Blessed Virgin Mary, full of grace, all-beautiful and all-pure, accompany us at every step along the way.”

We can begin our prayers by listening to today's Gospel of Luke. Jesus instills confidence in His disciples that they will receive from God that for which they pray. He teaches them to pray for our daily needs: the food we need to live, the forgiveness we need to grow our relationships and the protection we need to remain faithful. Because of what we have already received, we are certain that God will give even more to those who ask: the Holy Spirit!

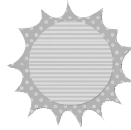

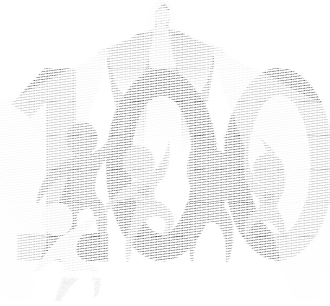

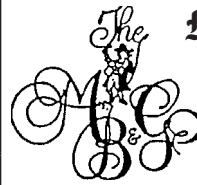
