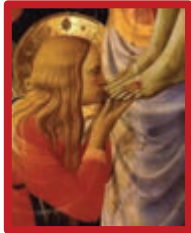

FEAST OF ST. MARY MAGDALENE

Patroness of Women, Converts, Penitents,
Sexual Temptation, Pharmacists, Tanners

July 22



Recognizing St. Mary Magdalene's role as the first to witness Christ's resurrection and as a "true and authentic evangelizer," Pope Francis raised the July 22 memorial of St. Mary Magdalene to a Feast on the church's liturgical calendar. A decree

formalizing the decision was published by the Congregation for Divine Worship along with an article titled "Apostolorum Apostola" ("Apostle of the Apostles") explaining its significance. In the article Arch. Arthur Roche, Secretary of the Congregation, wrote that in celebrating "an evangelist who proclaims the central joyous message of Easter," St. Mary Magdalene's Feast Day is a call for all Christians to "reflect more deeply on the mystery of divine mercy."

Preaching about St. Mary Magdalene, Pope Francis highlighted Christ's mercy toward a woman who was "exploited and despised by those who believed they were righteous," but she was loved and forgiven by Him. Her tears at Christ's empty tomb are a reminder that "sometimes in our lives, tears are the lenses we need to see Jesus," said the Pope on April 2, 2013, during Mass. Pope Francis also mentions her specifically in the prayer he composed for the Year of Mercy: "Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured paradise to the repentant thief."

Arch. Roche explained that in giving St. Mary Magdalene the honor of being the first person to see the empty tomb and the first to listen to the truth of the resurrection, "Jesus has a special consideration and mercy for this woman, who manifests her love for him, looking for him in the garden with anguish and suffering. "Drawing a comparison between Eve, who "spread death where there was life," and St. Mary Magdalene, who "proclaimed life from the tomb, a place of death," the Arch. said her Feast Day is a lesson for all Christians to trust in Christ who is "alive and risen." **"It is right that the liturgical celebration of this woman has the same level of Feast given to the celebration of the apostles in the general Roman calendar and highlights the special mission of this woman who is an example and model for every woman in the church."**

CARDINAL TOBIN REFLECTS ON HIS LIFE SINCE LEAVING INDIANAPOLIS

During the national conference of U.S. Bishops in Indianapolis in mid-June, *The Criterion* did a one-on-one interview with Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin of Newark, N.J. The following are some excerpts:



Q. What are some of the differences you've experienced between the two archdioceses?

A. "There are some real challenges that I didn't have to face here. One is the concentration of people. I'm only responsible for four counties instead of 39 counties here. But there are 1.6 million Catholics there, and we celebrate the Eucharist on Sunday in 23 languages. So those are the differences. "They're wonderful people there, and the diversity I find interesting."

Q. What do you think the Church needs to do to reach young people?

A. "The first thing the Church can do is be with young people. Pope Francis uses the word 'accompaniment.' It's sharing the road with young people, and having something to share with them. "I think if you enter their world, they're curious, at least about why you would even bother. I think young people today face challenges that I didn't face when I was in my teens and 20s. There is incredible pressure, and the pressure is translating into some really bad things like substance abuse and suicide. And many of them are coming from parents who weren't maybe catechized themselves, and they don't have the spiritual resources to fall back on."

Q. During the USCCB meeting in Indianapolis, you and Archbishop Charles J. Chaput of Philadelphia will lead a discussion on the 2018 Synod of Bishops with its focus on young people, faith and vocational discernment. Talk about the importance of the synod, and what you hope to accomplish during the meeting of the bishops.

A. "One is to ensure the bishops will engage in a consultative process so the real picture of young people, mission and vocation can be presented to the synod. Just as it is for any individual, self-knowledge is important for spirituality. For the Church in this process of discernment, you have to face reality as reality is. For example, here in the United States, many Bishops are concerned with the growth of unbelief among the youngest groups in the United States. How can we challenge them to listen to the God who speaks to them, who calls them?"

“But some seed fell on rich soil and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold. Whoever has ears ought to hear.”
